Dear Members & Friends,

Whatever happened to those so-called "lazy, hazy, crazy days of summer?" **SUNDAY SCHOOL TO BEGIN**

**September 12 at 8:45 a.m.**

This coming school year we will be taking a different approach to teaching our children in grades 1 - 8. The Preschool and Kindergarten Class will remain the same and again be taught by Kathy Ciampa and Sue Hepfer.

Grades 1 - 8 will be set up using a **rotation model to complete a thematic unit where the children will rotate from week to week through different workshops**. The workshops will generally be broken down into the following categories: **Audio/Visual; Art; Games; Worship; Computer/Technology; Story-telling/Creative Movement**.

The grades will be divided out as follows: **grades 1-3; grades 4-5; and grades 6-8**. Each of the three groups will have a leader who will be with them each week to take the group to the next workshop. As of now the plan is for each group to spend one Sunday in each workshop.

The workshops will be led by volunteers and should require each volunteer to be responsible for only a few weeks at a time. This model allows for different people to volunteer so that one person is not committed to teaching

all year unless they choose to do so. After the children have gone through all of the workshops, another thematic unit will begin. The schedule for the year is as follows:

Oct. 17 - Oct. 31	The Reformation
Nov. 7 - Dec. 19	The 12 Days of Christmas
Jan. 2 - Jan. 30	Boy Jesus in the Temple
Feb. 6 - Mar. 6	Mission Workshop
Mar. 13 - Apr. 10	Holy Week
May 1 - Jun. 12	Psalm 8
