Review the sermon. What were the main points?

In this sermon series **Ephesians 2:8-9** has been referenced multiple times. How does it relate to this sermon?

Grace can be a somewhat nebulous term. What does it mean to you? How would you explain it to someone who does not know what it means within the Christian faith?

Often in church there is talk of being steward of our financial resources. How does thinking of being stewards of God's grace expand the responsibility we have?

In the parable of the talents the good stewards doubled the resources the master gave them. What might it mean to "double the grace" God has extended to you?
