## Beebouts Leaving Niger

At the beginning of the Summer the Beebout family packed a few suitcases to spend two months in Iowa. While they were here in the USA there was a coup in Niger, their home for over 15 years. In the span of a week the entire situation in Niger changed. While the ministry of the two medical clinics has been able to continue, it has become clear that God is closing this chapter in the Beebout's ministry. It has been hard for them, but they also can see God's hand in it.

They have been provided with a place to stay in Iowa and opportunities for temporary work while they adjust to life in the USA and discern what God has for them as they look toward their future. In October the mission team was able to meet with Susan via Zoom and express our support and pray with her.

Jeremey and Susan plan on returning to Niger one last time to sell all their belongings, and bring closure to their incredible time serving the Lord in a predominantly Muslim country. ERC is committed to supporting them financially during this time of transition. If God calls them to return to the mission field in another country, we will hopefully be a continued partner in their ministry.

# Boiler and Roof

*Sometimes we have major expenses...*

Over the coming months we are looking at two major expenses here at ERC. The immediate need is a new boiler. Our high efficiency natural gas boiler has a bad circuit board, and it is old enough that replacement parts are not available. The best option is a complete replacement. We have committed to a competitive bid, and should be getting a new boiler before mid-December. The cost is \$15,000.

Additionally, we only have one section of roof that is old (the road side of the Fellowship Hall), and to avoid problems we need to have the roof replaced. The work will happen in the spring, and we are in the process of getting quotes. Initial quotes are just above \$15,000.

The good news is that we are able to cover these expenses, the other side is that they will use a significant percentage of our reserves. If you are able to make a donation to help with these important property needs, mark your special offering "building fund." Thank you.

## Financial Update

When those who are part of Emmanuel Reformed do their part in giving faithfully to the work of the church, our financial needs are always met. This is a reminder that inflation and unexpected expenses (noted above) are part of the church's financial reality. Giving is currently about 3% behind where we projected to be at this point. # Jesse Tree

Advent Devotional and Sermon Series

For Advent we will be using a Jesse Tree to guide us from Genesis to Jesus. The prophet Isaiah gives the imagery of a new branch springing to life from an old stump. The picture points to Jesus, who was of the line of King David, the son of Jesse. It looked like all hope was lost, the kingdom was destroyed, there was no reason for hope, but the prophet says something amazing is yet to come—something which will transform the world.

There will be a devotional book available later this month which will take you through the Old Testament as we see how God works everything together for His redemptive purpose—centered around Jesus who was born in Bethlehem. The Jesse Tree devotional will have a reading for each day from December 1 to 25, and Sunday sermons will lift up important lessons from this powerful way to read the Bible.
