Notes on Pastor Steward's monthly letter from NE India...

Steward opens his letter observing the greatly increased persecution against Christians in their area by the BJP Hindu party in the government. As an example, he cites how 132 believers belonging to Tiwa's tribe were forcefully reconverted to their ancestral religion. Hindu's fanatical leaders are shouting everywhere that India's greatest enemy is Christianity. Because of this Steward explains that suddenly the atmosphere in the villages has changed and some who want to receive Christ are afraid to do so openly and not coming to baptism. In response, Steward gives a hearty AMEN, as should we all, to Romans 8:31,38-39: "What, then, shall we say in response to this? If God is for us, who can be against us? Neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord!"
